the Catanduanes State University

As the only premier public higher education institution in the province, Catanduanes State University (CatSU), which was formerly known as Catanduanes State Colleges (CSC), has evolved since the passage of Republic Act 3398, which established Virac National Agricultural Trade School (VNATS); until a decade later, when then Catanduanes Congressman Jose M. Alberto authored Republic Act 6341, which converted VNATS into Catanduanes State Colleges (CSC) on June 19, 1971.

Having a university in the island-province was the ultimate dream of every Catandunganon. As Congressman Alberto began to work on fulfilling this dream, the economic and political climate at that time prevented it, so he settled for the creation of the CSC.

The academic institution has two campuses within the island-province of Catanduanes. Its main campus is located at Calatagan Proper in the capital town of Virac; and the other campus, the CatSU-Panganiban Campus (formerly CAIC), is located in the northern municipality of Panganiban.

Categorized as SUC-Level III-A, the institution is now considered as a comprehensive Higher Education Institution in Catanduanes, and acknowledged as one of the dynamic SUCs in the Bicol region offering a wide range of academic programs.

On December 1, 1971, the school started functioning as a tertiary educational institution, which initially offered courses including Associate in Business Education, Associate in Commerce, Bachelor of Science in Education, Master of Arts in Education, and Master of Arts in Commerce.

Additional courses were offered on July 8, 1972 by virtue of RA 6590. On July 22, 1996, the Tenth Congress of the Republic of the Philippines enacted and approved Republic Act No. 8292, which provided for the uniform composition and powers of the governing board, the manner of appointment and the term of office of the President of chartered state universities and colleges, and for other purposes.

On October 31, 1999, the Catanduanes Agricultural and Industrial College (CAIC) in Panganiban, Catanduanes, was integrated into the CSC. The move was in conformity with the Special Provision No. 2 of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) FY 1999 Budget under the General Appropriations Act of 1999.

In 1993, CAIC was renamed as CSC Panganiban Campus as an offshoot of the approved Revised Organizational Structure per Board Resolution No. 15, s. 2003.

Not forgetting about the dream of every Catandunganon, the journey of the institution towards its conversion into a University was started, this time in the halls of the academe itself, under the visionary administration of CSC President Dr. Rodolfo V. Azanza (1986-1990) when the saga of the institution's internationalization initiatives and faculty scholarships abroad were dynamically initiated.

The culture of research and publication was likewise established along with the strengthening of the graduate school during Dr. Rodolfo V. Azanza's term. These initiatives were followed through by President Adolfo S. Bagadiong.

The succeeding administrations of Dr. Asuncion V. Asetre and Minerva I. Morales, both scholars under the term of Dr. Rodolfo V. Azanza, would continue that pursuit for university-hood as they shared the same vision for the institution, thus, encouraging local leaders to initiate parallel legislative support.

Thereby, in support of legislative fiat to the institution, then Catanduanes Congressman Leandro B. Verceles Jr. initiated his complementary effort in the conversion of the Colleges into a University during his first term in the 9th Congress of the Republic of the Philippines, serving as the lone representative of Catanduanes from 1992 until 1995.

The same fervor was passed on to the next Congressman of the Lone District of Catanduanes, Joseph A. Santiago whose term started in 2001, and who like his predecessors also worked hard for the conversion of CSC into a University. In short, all previous academic leaders and political stalwarts of the island, painstakingly laid the groundwork for the transformation of CSC into a University.

It was only on March 29, 2011, however, that finally the dream of every Catandunganon to have a University within the island would come to fruition when during the First Regular Session of the 15th Congress of the Republic of the Philippines, then Catanduanes Congressman Cesar V. Sarmiento with strong support from then Congressman Juan Edgardo M. Angara as co-author, filed House Bill No. 4170, entitled: "An Act Converting the Catanduanes State Colleges in the Province of Catanduanes Into A State University to be known as the Catanduanes State University, and Appropriating Funds Therefor."

Over a year thereafter, President Benigno Simeon S. Aquino III signed on October 19, 2012 Republic Act No. 10229 converting Catanduanes State Colleges (CSC)- Virac/Main Campus and Panganiban Campus into Catanduanes State University.

Today, the university embraces a new era of leadership under its 7th president, Dr. Patrick Alain T. Azanza. His tenure is marked by a commitment to inclusive development, servant-leadership, and a transformative vision for global competitiveness.

Under Dr. Azanza's visionary leadership and guidance, CatSU aims to become a globally-competitive green research university, supported by innovative economic zones and smart campuses, all designed to propel the institution into a new horizon of academic excellence and community service.

ENROLLMENT STATISTICS

The Catanduanes State University, the only premier Public Higher Education Institution in the province, recorded at least 15% enrolment increase with 14,189 students for the 1st semester of the academic year 2023-2024, compared to last school year's 12,354.

Anent this, almost 92% or 13,034 students enrolled in undergraduate degree programs, and only 5% or 749 students are from the Laboratory Schools while the remaining 3% or 433 students enrolled in the graduate degree programs.

ACCREDITED PROGRAMS

To ensure the quality of every curricular program being offered by any university in the country, a recognized accrediting body like the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACUP) conducts quality assurance procedure to undergraduate and graduate programs.

As of December 2023, the AACUP had accredited 39 programs being offered by CatSU. Of the total accredited programs of the university, 12 programs are qualified for Level III accreditation, 16 programs have passed the Level II accreditation, 9 programs are qualified for Level I accreditation, and 2 programs are under candidate status.

LIBRARY SERVICES

Most people think of a classic library as a building with rows and rows of books where a bit of noise is not welcome. But not at Catanduanes State University, as this quiet place has been transformed in 2023 into a hub of creativity with its modern design, relaxing atmosphere, and adaptive library furniture. The university twostory e-library is equipped with air-conditioning units, comfortable sofas and elegant chairs and tables complemented with free Wi-Fi connectivity.

Beyond its physical transformation, the university library management in 2023 likewise acquired numerous books, and offered free access to its online resources like Science Direct and Scopus. It also subscribed with Gale OneFile, Philippine Ejournal, IGLibrary Publishing, and Philippine Ebook Hub. In terms of book circulation, the book hub was able to reach 5,469 at the end of December 2023, while a total of 63,322 users in its six sections were recorded.

SCHOLARSHIP AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS FOR STUDENTS

In the field of education, finance plays a pivotal role in enabling students to continue their studies. In the Philippines, public state universities and colleges offer free higher education to qualified students, including from the Catanduanes State University, who are exempt from paying tuition and other school fees. However, despite the availability of free education, some students are still struggling to pursue their studies due to additional expenses such as food, lodging, and books. To address this issue, the University provides various scholarship and financial assistance programs that cover these expenses, which are funded by different benefactors. In the second semester of Academic Year 2022-2023, a total of 1,734 students received educational assistance, and this number increased by almost 84% in the first semester of Academic Year 2023-2024, with a total of 3,195 student-beneficiaries.

Responsive to our society's emerging needs, the research and development thrust of the University continues to evolve in that direction, taking to mind the conscious effort to instill a research culture among its faculty, students, and non-teaching staff. Research as a driver of academic excellence has scaled to newer paths as it takes a more dynamic focus.

RESEARCH WORKS AND PUBLICATIONS

As an academe, one of the mandates of the University is Research. In the fiscal year 2023, the Research and Development Services documented a comprehensive overview of the university's scholarly endeavors. A total of 30 research projects were successfully completed by faculty members across nine colleges, including the Panganiban Campus.

Remarkably, the College of Humanities and Social Sciences emerged as the most contributor to scholarly inquiry, boasting a remarkable tally of 9 completed research projects.

These scholarly endeavors found dissemination and recognition on both national and international platforms. Notably, 20 research studies garnered publication in academic journals, while an impressive total of 39 investigations were presented at various prestigious conferences, spanning international, national, regional, and local arenas.

Moreover, the university's commitment to safeguarding intellectual property rights was evidenced by the issuance of 19 certificates of copyright registrations. The university's innovative contributions to knowledge generation extended to the realm of technological innovation, with 7 research inventions being submitted for patent consideration.

These remarkable achievements underscore the university's unwavering dedication to advancing the frontiers of knowledge through rigorous scholarly inquiry and innovative research endeavors.

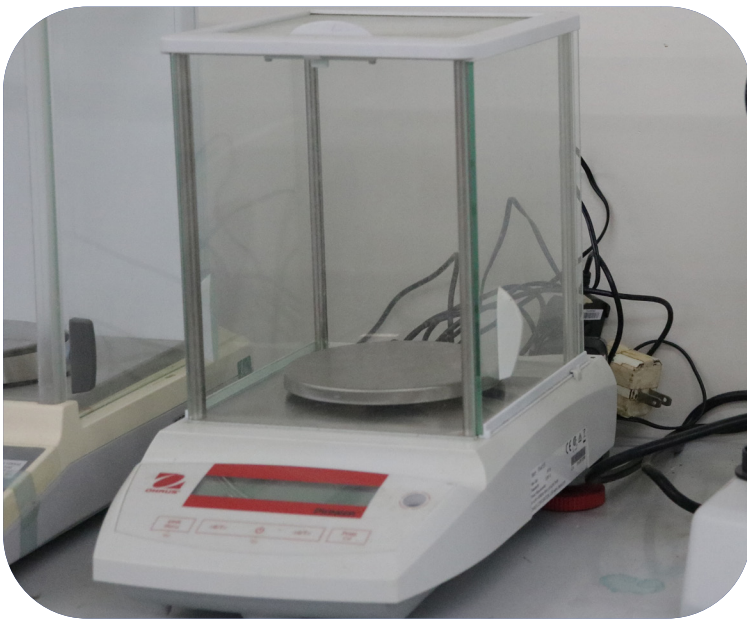
ABACA TECHNOLOGY INNOVATION CENTER

The Catanduanes State University (CatSU) has been immersed at the forefronts of rural communities in extending its services arm to the needy and underprivileged sectors of society.

Through different modes of technical assistance, livelihood trainings, values orientation, skills enhancement, etc., the University responds to these needs while making itself relevant to its mission of contributing to societal development.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

Extension is one of the four mandates of the Catanduanes State University aside from instruction, production, and research. The University recognizes its significant role in societal development and improving the quality of life of the underserved and marginalized communities. It fulfills its obligation through the establishment of the Office of Extension Service

In the year 2023, a total of 46 training sessions were conducted, accompanied by the establishment of collaborative

ventures with various organizations and government bodies. These collaborations comprised of different projects, focusing on food processing, training workshops, and livelihood endeavors.

Under the visionary leadership of University President Dr. Patrick Alain T. Azanza, the 'Padagos na Patanos Movement', a community service program, was launched. This movement has filled the gap between the academe and the community, opening the doors of the

university for all. Medical missions, sports clinics, eye examinations, distribution of eyeglasses, and provision of wheelchairs were among the programs initiated, which notably benefited residents across 11 municipalities of Catanduanes.

PERSONNEL STATISTICS

Employees are the lifeblood of any institution including in a university. In Catanduanes State University, they serve as the driving force in fulfilling the university's mandate to serve effectively and efficiently its clientele, contributing to the national development of the country. To strengthen further the university's educational mandate, CatSU continued its commitment to uphold meritocracy-based hiring process under Dr. Patrick Alain T. Azanza's leadership and in 2023, it was able to hire a total of 34 regular non-teaching positions, 14 of whom male and 20 female. For regular teaching position, 33 were hired, 4 of whom were considered as permanent while the remaining 29 were temporary-permanent. In total, the university had a strong workforce last year with 592 employees, 276 of them were male and 316 were female.
