CatSU CEA BSCpE students go on week-long Educational Tour in Metro Manila to enhance learning experience

The Catanduanes State University (CatSU) College of Engineering and Architecture's BS in Computer Engineering (CEA BSCpE) sent off its sixty-seven (67) fourth-year students and two (2) faculty coordinators, Engr. Ronnie B. Santelices and Engr. Morris U. Aquino, for a week-long educational tour in Metro Manila on February 26, 2023

The tour aimed to ensure a sustainable teaching and learning delivery process and included extracurricular pursuits to increase the students' learning chances and develop the connection between academia and industry in line with the

Computer Engineering program criteria.

Engr. Santelices, the Computer Engineering Department Chair, stated that these extracurricular activities were designed to support and help students have a more fulfilling learning experience outside the regular classroom teaching programs.

During the tour, the students visited several notable institutions. At the PAGASA Science Garden in Diliman, Quezon City, they observed cutting-edge technology used to provide weather-related information, goods, and services, making communities more resilient to

typhoons, floods, landslides, and other extreme weather events.

The students also went to the DOST Advanced Science and Technology Institute (DOST-ASTI) and the DOST Electronic Product Development Center (DOST-EPDC), both in Diliman, Quezon City. They were introduced to the scientific research and development of advanced domains like information and communications technology, microelectronics, and the provision of prototype design and fabrication of printed circuit boards (PCB) and electronic product testing.



The tour also included a visit to Hytec Power Incorporated in Novaliches, Quezon City. Here, students learned about the provision of consistent industrial solutions to common industry problems to increase job productivity, operational efficiency, workplace safety, and job skill mismatch solutions.

Another stop was Packetworx IoT Technology Hub in Ortigas Center, Pasig, Metro Manila. Packetworx is the leading source of hardware and software solutions for system integrators and developers to use in the development of various IoT solutions.

Included in the itinerary also was the Polytechnic University of the Philippines (PUP) - College of Engineering and Architecture in Sta. Mesa, Manila. The

students saw the college's technological advancement in computer laboratories and equipment that provides greater opportunity for students.

The De La Salle-College of Saint Benilde was also visited, where the Multimedia Arts curriculum combines essential skills such as communication, programming, and graphic design with cutting-edge technology like digital media and the Internet.

Lastly, the group visited the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) in Taguig City. TESDA is mandated to establish an accreditation system for institutions engaged in middle-level manpower development and support technical education and skills development programs and

initiatives. The Green Technology Center, Technology, Research and Development Division, Competence Assessment Division, Mechatronics Labs, and Learning Development Division were all made open to students.

"We are thankful to our College Dean, Engr. Pedro A. Arcilla, Jr., and of course to our SUC President, Dr. Patrick Alain T. Azanza, for all the support and guidance in this educational trip for our students. Our senior students are also grateful for the approval by our officials, that they have been sent to do fish bowling, have been given access to effective and engaging learning experience through worthwhile off-campus activities, and ultimately, have been given the chance of getting a taste of the real world," Engr. Aquino said.

Catanduanes State University President Dr. Patrick Alain T. Azanza announced earlier this month the appointment of Dr. Bernardino C. Abundo Jr. as the new Vice President for Admin and Finance Affairs.

The goal of this appointment is to provide excellent administrative and financial services to all clients, in line with the plans and programs under the Vision of HOPE of the current administration.

Dr. Abundo is tasked with crafting and calibrating new strategies and mechanisms to address various, including existing concerns for the university.

In addition, Dr. Abundo has conducted notable research, including the Organization Effectiveness of EBMC as an economic enterprise in 2020, which was officially requested by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Catanduanes.

As VP for AFA, Dr. Abundo is expected to assume responsibility in the planning, implementation, and monitoring of the administrative and

financial division, including Records Services, Human Resource Management Services, Security Services, Building and Grounds Services, Motor Pool Services, Accounting Services, Budget Services, Cashiering Services, and Supply Services.

He will also be responsible for generating external funding management and supervision of externally generated income/donations, grants, and infrastructure projects and other physical facilities. Additionally, he will provide leadership and workable arrangements for personal growth and development.

Dr. Abundo's duties as VP also include reviewing and approving the performance evaluation rating of employees under the Admin and Fin Services and preparing/submitting quarterly, mid-year, annual accomplishment, and other reports of the Admin & Finance Division of the University as required along MFO, among others.

Dr. Abundo's appointment is expected to bring fresh perspectives and strategies to CatSU's administrative and financial affairs, ensuring that the university continues to provide excellent service to its clientele.

Dr. Joseph G. Zafe, Associate Professor V at Catanduanes State University (CatSU), has been appointed as the new Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs. This recommendation was made by the Administrative Council on February 28, 2023, and was unanimously approved by the Board of Regents during its 1st Quarter/208th Regular Meeting on March 6, 2023, at CHED Central Office in Manila.

Dr. Zafe began his career as a professional teacher in 2000 at Pio Del Pilar Elementary School in Manila, where he was awarded "Outstanding Teacher in Filipino" in 2002 and "Model Teacher of the Year" in the same year. He also served as a Division Demonstration teacher in various subject areas during his tenure in a public elementary school.

In 2006, Dr. Zafe transferred to his hometown and was employed as an Instructor I at CatSU. He was later promoted to Instructor II in 2011, Assistant Professor II in October 2016, Associate Professor IV in January 2020, and Associate Professor V in 2021 to present.

Dr. Zafe also served as an extension coordinator in various community services. He represented the College of Education from 2013 to 2017, and during

this period, the College was granted the highest accreditation level, level 4, by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACUP). At the same time, he was also designated as Director for the Center for International Relations and Continuing Professional Development Services, now headed by Prof. Zyra Mae T. Tumala.

Dr. Zafe has achieved various prominent affiliations and honors, such as being a national Top Scorer in the Qualifying Examination for Accreditors in the AACUP, where Vice Presidents, Deans, Directors, and faculty members of the different State Universities (SUCs) in the Philippines participated.

Dr. Zafe holds a Bachelor of Elementary Education degree, completed his academic requirements for Master's Degree at the Philippine Normal University, and graduated with a Master of Arts in Education, Major in Administration and Supervision at CatSU in 2009. He obtained his Doctor of Education, Major in Educational Management in the same university in 2015, and he is currently working on his second doctorate degree, Philosophy in Educational Management.

As the new Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs, Dr. Zafe is expected to

take charge of the processing, evaluation, and conduct of a feasibility study on the eighteen (18) new courses to be offered by CatSU. He is also responsible for planning Centers for Excellence and Centers for Development, as well as the adoption of the Expanded Tertiary Education Equivalency and Accreditation Program. In addition, Dr. Zafe will be responsible for improving CatSU's classification level to attain SUC Level IV and assisting the VP for Academic Affairs and Chief Academic Officer, Dr. Patrick Alain T. Azanza, in all academic matters, including upholding the quality of education at CatSU and being included in the Quacquarelli Symonds World Ranking of Universities, the leading Global Education Network.

Dr. Zafe's expertise and commitment are evident in his published papers in national and international research journal publications and numerous seminars related to his profession as an educator. His professional career revolves around serving the people, especially the students, through his passion for teaching and serving the academic community. Therefore, Dr. Zafe is the perfect assistant to CatSU's academic arm.

CEA fest triumphantly returns after two-year hiatus, showcasing students' unique talents

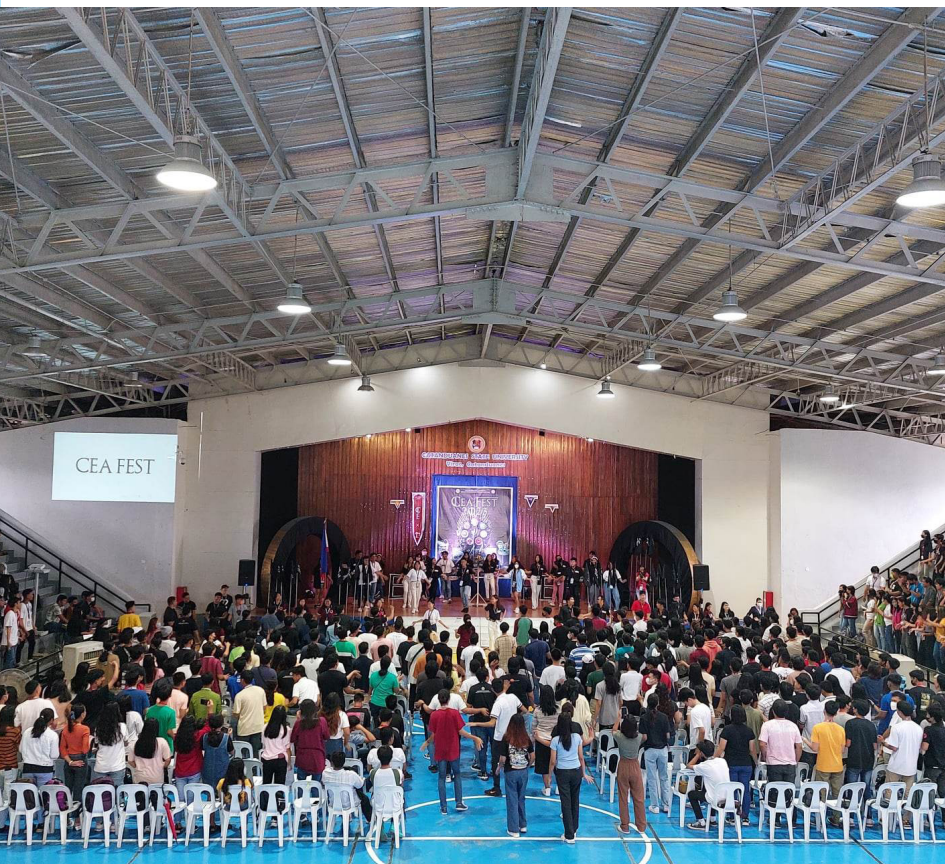

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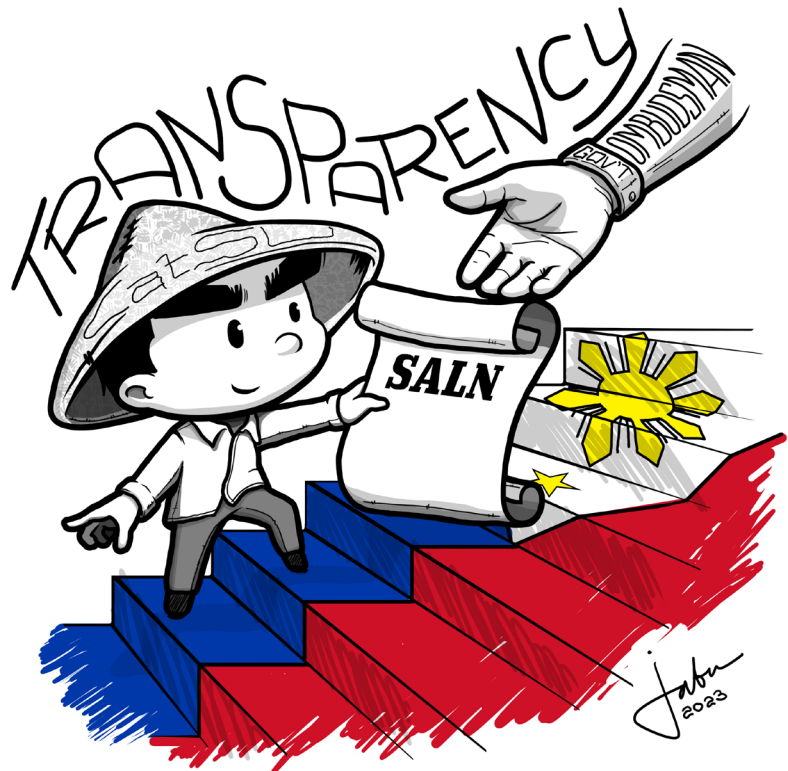
