he National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) Region 5 - Bicol donated a secondhand 9-seater Mitsubishi Adventure to Catanduanes State University (CatSU) on January 5, 2023.

he Catanduanes State University will host a two-day musical play directed by award-winning Director, Atty. Vince M. Tańada at the CatSU Gymnasium on February 5 and 6, 2023 at 8:00AM, 11:00AM, 2:00PM, and 5:00PM.

"Bayani Love, Heroes in Concert," is an artistic presentation of the struggles of our national heroes as they fought for freedom for the people they loved. Written by Tańada, the play is a jukebox musical that features love stories from known national heroes such as Lapu-Lapu and Bulakna, Gabriela and Diego Silang, Antonio Luna and Nellie Bousted, Juan Luna and Paz Pardo de Tavera, Jose Rizal and Josephine Bracken, and Andres Bonifacio and Gregoria De Jesús.

The production will be staged by the Philippine Stagers Foundation (PSF), a highly acclaimed organization known for its outstanding musical productions. PSF has been recognized by the TAYO Awards Foundation, Dangal ng Bansa by the Komisyon sa Wikang Filipino, and the Aliw Awards and Broadway World Awards for its multi-award-winning productions. In 2013, PSF was awarded the Best Program for Culture and the Arts at the 22nd KBP Golden Dove Awards.

Atty. Tańada, a highly decorated awardee in FAMAS, STAR, GOLDEN DOVE, CMMA, and ALIW, and the awardwinning Director of the movie KATIPS, hopes that students and teachers in the island province of Catanduanes will be able to witness the play and learn more about history, culture, and values through the medium of theater arts.

Tańada, who is also the Founder and Artistic Director of PSF, assures that the musical play will benefit the audience not only academically, as it focuses on a holistic approach to studying Modern Literature and Philippine History, but it is also an artistic masterpiece in theater production that has never been seen before in the Philippines.

Dr. Ramon Felipe Sarmiento, Vice President for Research, Extension, and Production Affairs (VP REPA), is thrilled about the upcoming musical play that the University will be hosting. The VP REPA expressed his excitement over the rare opportunity to host and witness a musical play, and emphasized the importance of promoting it to students as a unique experience.

### CEA gathers for Student Research Colloquium

he College of Engineering and Architecture (CEA) at the Catanduanes State University (CatSU) recently hosted its first annual Student Research Colloquium from January 25-27, 2023 at the CatSU Auditorium.

The goal of the event was to provide students with a platform to showcase their research projects, improve their public speaking abilities, and receive feedback from experts in the field.

Participated in by students and faculty from Civil Engineering and Computer Engineering, the third-year students served as facilitators, with Engr. Dexter M. Toyado and Engr. Ronnie B. Santelices as the overall coordinator. Panelists included Ms. Mae Ezra Abundo, Director of Information Technology Services (ITS), and Mr. Neil B. Araojo, Technical Specialist of ITS.

"Students have the opportunity to work closely with a mentor, who can be a faculty member or experienced researcher, through the faculty-initiated research colloquium," says Engr. Ms. Abundo, in her message, emphasized the significance of research in filling knowledge gaps and encouraged students to develop their research skills. The colloquium was designed to provide fourth-year students with an opportunity to present their research results and improve their presentation abilities.

"The Research Colloquium is an ideal place to learn something new, hone problem-solving skills, and challenge themselves in new ways through research. We also want to allow



student researchers to share important information and findings from their studies with the academic community", Ms. Abundo said.

Mr. Araojo, on the other hand, added that the colloquium was a valuable chance for students to become familiar with the research world and prepare for their final defense. He noted that it allowed students to revise their projects, produce writing samples, and become comfortable with the academic conference environment.

The overall coordinators of the research colloquium, Engr. Toyado

and Engr. Santelices, expressed their gratitude for the successful outcome of the event.

"As the CEA's research coordinator, the CEA's Research Colloquium 2023 has provided an excellent platform for student researchers to present their research, as well as its effects and community benefits. Similarly, healthy collaborations among the panel of evaluators were encouraged for the improvement of the aforementioned endeavors," Engr. Toyado, said.

"Junior engineering students had the




**Prof. Zyra Mae T. Tumala,** CIRPDS Director (2nd from left, topmost), attends the COIL orientation via Zoom.

nursing, biomedicine, alternative/ complementary medicine, consumer health, and 17 other allied health disciplines. The database also includes full-text coverage dating back to 1937, making it a valuable resource for those in the nursing and allied health fields.

The Full Text in EBSCO is enhanced with the Full Text Finder (FTF), which makes it easy to discover and access journal articles and e-books. The database also offers access to healthcare books, dissertations, selected conference proceedings, standards of practice, educational software, audiovisuals, and book chapters. In addition, it provides searchable cited references for over 1,420 journals. Ms. Jena T. Perez, the College Librarian III, encourages students and faculty in the College of Health Sciences to take advantage of this comprehensive research database. She believes that the additional resources included, such as full-text evidence-based care sheets and continuing education modules, will be valuable in their studies.

## DILG, CatSU present CapDev Analysis to assist PLGU, MLGUs in the province

he Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) Catanduanes Province, led by Provincial Director Uldarico Razal Jr., and the Catanduanes State University

(CatSU) Capacity Development Team presented the CapDev Analysis to the Provincial Local Government Unit (PLGU) and Municipal Local Government Units (MLGUs) on January 31, 2023, at Rhaj Inn in Virac, Catanduanes.

The presentation aimed to inform the PLGU on the areas they can assist the MLGUs with in capacity development and the interventions needed to address their CapDev needs.

The PLGU, headed by Governor Joseph C. Cua and represented by Provincial Administrator Lemuel Surtida, attended the event along with the Municipal Mayors, Municipal Planning and Development Coordinators, Municipal Local Government Operations Officers, CatSU CapDev Analysis Team, and other stakeholders.

According to Section 10 of EO No. 8 s. 2021 on the Mandanas-Garcia Supreme Court Ruling, LGUs are required to prepare DTPs as requirements for the implementation of full devolution. These DTPs need to be analyzed to determine common and unique capacity priorities and to communicate the analysis results to stakeholders.

The CatSU CapDev Team is composed of SUC President III Dr. Patrick Alain T. Azanza, Executive Vice President Dr. Lily P. Custodio, Assistant Vice President for Administrative and Financial Affairs Dr. Arthur I.
