(eCLCCAP), on November 21-25, 2022 at the Ace Hotel and Suites, Pasig City.

The training conference was a collaborative program through the office of the Philippine Climate Change Commission, in partnership with the Department of Interior and Local Government.

The five (5) days training schedule include sessions on Coaching Techniques for effective facilitation and Active Learning, Climate Change 101 & Top 10 Climate-induced Risks in PH, Situating LCCAP in CDP, Stakeholders Participation, Climate Change Projections and other Climate Change Information, Organizing Climate Change and Hazard Information, Scoping Potential Impacts of Climate Change & Hazards, Developing the Exposure Database, Climate and Disaster Risk Management, Discussion and Workshop on the emissions of different sectors such as Energy and Transport, Agriculture, Forestry, Waste, and Industry, and a lot more.

Preliminaries and Recap also include Planning, Prioritizing, Budgeting, Monitoring, Evaluating, Adjusting, and Modifying, and lastly the Climate Change Expenditure tagging. In closing, the Peoples Survival Fund and Ways Forward were also tackled

It can be recalled that Dr. Azanza encouraged the CatSU community to work with him in pushing for the plans of making the institution a national university for Disaster Management and Climate Change, just like the Batangas State University that is a National University of Engineering programs in his message during the celebration of the 10th Charter University Anniversary of CatSU.

"Lets claim it because there is no other university in the Philippines nor in the whole world that can compete with CatSU. Based on our culture, when a disaster strikes we are very much prepared; we are, as people, resilient to all types of disasters, the Mayon Volcano eruption affecting us, earthquakes, potential troubles with tsunami and the typhoons that may come every so often in the island," Dr. Azanza said.

"This training by the eLCCAP is indeed very timely as right now we are again planting a new seed, so the dream of becoming a university is something that has been there planned by our forebears, now it is our turn for the next generation, for the future of becoming a national university for Disaster Response and Climate Change, and that would greatly help in our efforts of putting CatSU in the world map" he added.

The 18-Day Campaign to End Violence against Women is observed in the Philippines every year from November 25 to December 12. The United Nations (UN) has defined violence against women (V.A.W.) as "any act of gender-based violence that results in, or likely to result in, physical, sexual, or mental harm or suffering to women, including threats of such acts, coercion or arbitrary deprivation of liberty, whether occurring in public or private life." Its considered one of the Philippines' perennial social problems, which is why then-President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo signed Proclamation 1172, extending it to 18 days in 2006.



Research and Development Services (RDS) Updates (From Catanduanes State University Research and Development Services Page)

TEC evaluates twenty-five (25) research proposals presented last November 16, 2022, at the RDS Prime Building.

The proposals were classified according to nature and specialization, and faculty experts/researchers from the Technical Evaluation Committee reviewed each proposal. Each sub-groups were selected based on the expertise needed to evaluate the soundness of the study. The TEC scrutinized particularly the Statement of the Problems/Objectives, scope, design, methodology, budgetary requirements, duration, FTE units, and research instrument.

Based on nature, 10 proposals belong to the non-S&T (Science and Technology) category while 15 belong to the S&T category. Moreover, the number of proposals based on specialization were: Education - 4, Social Science and Humanities -5, Business and Economics -1, Natural Sciences/Agriculture - 5, Health and Nutrition Sciences - 2, and Engineering and Technology-7.

After all approved studies were revised, the RDS recommends the proposals to the University Research and Extension Council (UREC), the final Body to approve the studies for contract, which are expected to be implemented on 2nd semester, 2022-2023.

To encourage more researchers and meet the targets set for CY 2023, a Special Presentation of Research Proposals and TEC review was scheduled. A total of 11 new research proposals were presented and evaluated by their respective panel of experts from the TEC. The number of new proposals under each category were: Education (3), Social Science and Humanities (2), Engineering and Technology (3), and Health and Nutrition (3).

All proposals are expected to be revised according to the comments and suggestions by the TEC, and submitted to RDS for re-checking and endorsement to the UREC.

CatSU Flower Garden: The University's Flower power

Born from the Presidents love of agriculture, the 4-hectare vegetable and flower farm with Known-You-Seeds; and the high-tech indoor three-in-one hydroponics, aquaponics and aeroponics with solar power will launch the what would be known as the Smart Agriculture in the University.

On October 21, 2022, just in time of the CatSU Charter Day celebration, the CatSU Flower Farm was launched and has been opened to the public; one that will also serve as a spot for agricultural/flower propagation demo areas for edu-tourism.

The CatSU Flower Farm is a part of the now approved Knowledge, Innovations, Science and Technology (KIST) Park by the Philippine Economic Zone Authority (PEZA). It is located across the Risen Christ Chapel and is previously the rice field of CatSU along the main highway across the airport.

It has gone through planning stage and with the help of the Known-You Seed Co., Ltd., a professional seed company in Taiwan, engaging in breeding, production, and marketing of F1 hybrid vegetable and flower varieties for more than 40 years, the green hands of our farmers from the College of Agriculture were able to plant the seeds and quickly grew different breed of flowers.

It includes the very popular Celosia, Sunflower, Globe Amaranth, Cosmos, Cockscomb, Zenia and Petunia. It also features the very remarkable handcrafting of the CatSU 1961 arrangement of planted flowers to showcase the roots of the universitys foundation.

At first, it was a trial and error experiment on the part of the CAF staff, checking how these flowers, mostly of the breed are popular in other countries, would also adapt to the islands kind of soil. But growing flowers is indeed a kind of art where we as human beings would be taught to understand those full life cycles, how they will play with other creatures, whether insects or animals, including human beings, is really important.

The CatSU flower garden is such a delight to see. In no time at all, it has been a spot for everybody for different occasions of photo shoot and pictorials, from the students, to the employees and everyone from all walks of life. 
