
STUDENTS ENROLLED IN CHED/RDC PRIORITY PROGRAMS (Per College/Campus)




ENROLLMENT IN RESEARCH DEGREE PROGRAMS


STRATEGIC SEMINAR-WORKSHOP FOR GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT September 30, 2020


This is a week-long activity done annually to commemorate the founding and University charter anniversary of the institution.
