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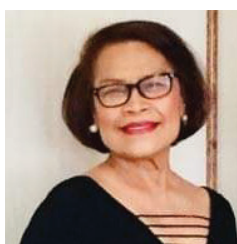
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Vision, Mission, Goals and Core Values

Uphold the tradition of excellence in instruction, research and production functions in an eco-friendly environment.

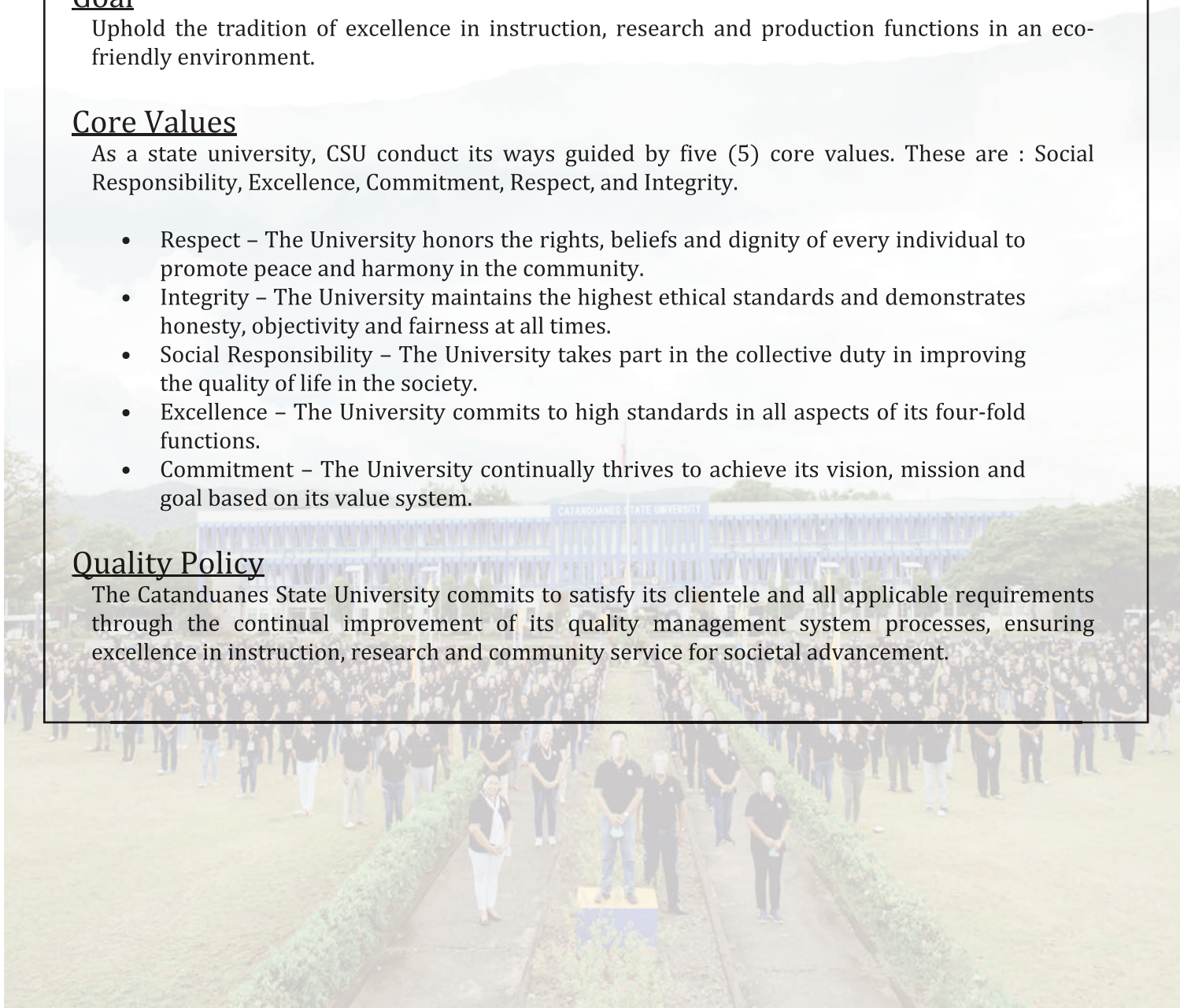
Core Values

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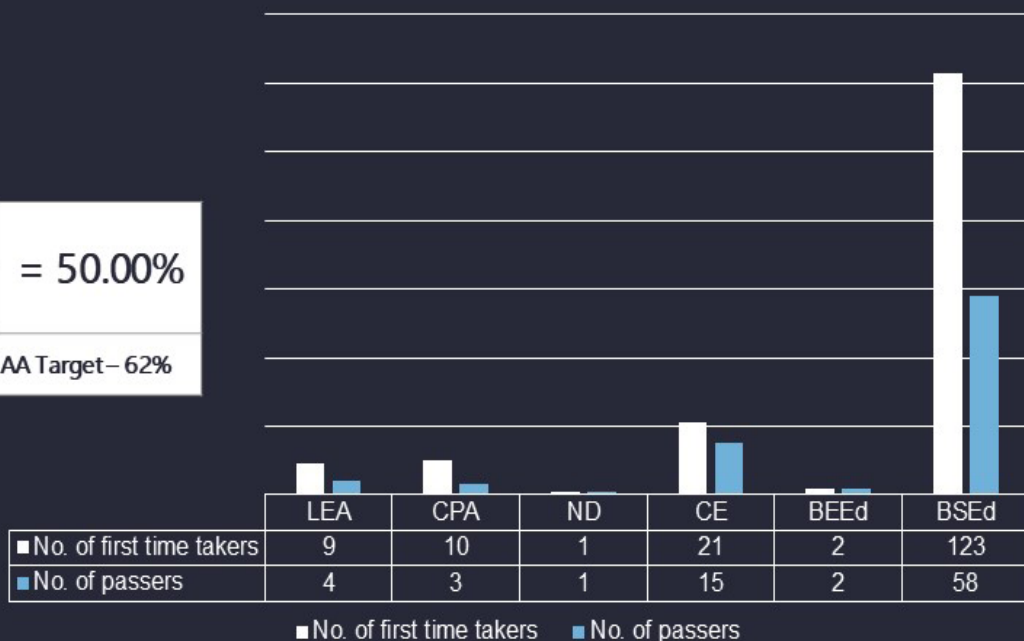

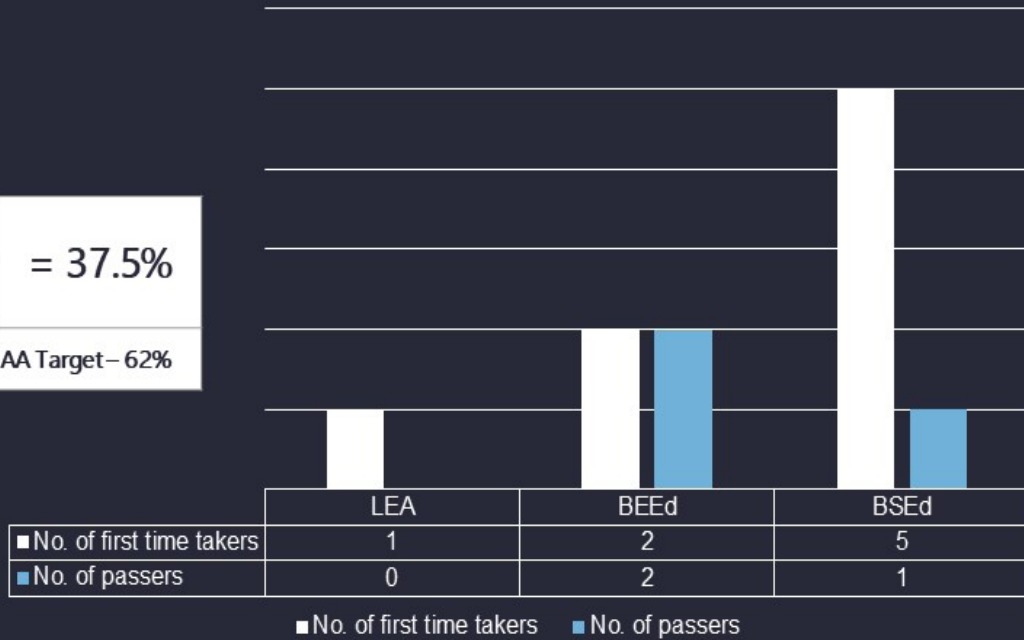
Number of first-time licensure exam takers that pass the licensure exams (MAIN CAMPUS)

Number of first-time licensure exam takers that pass the licensure exams (PANGANIBAN CAMPUS)

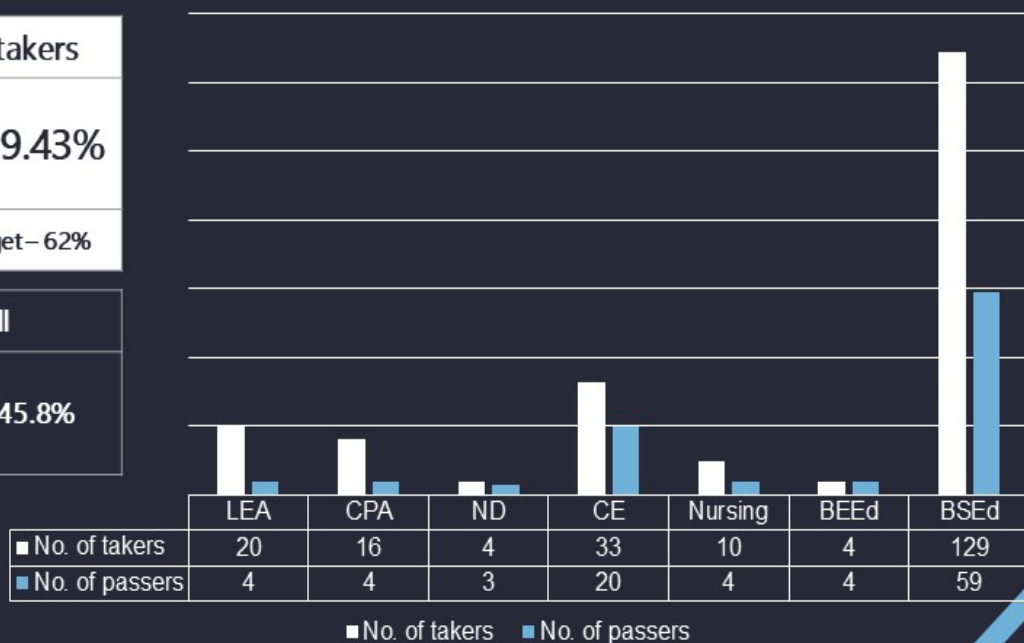

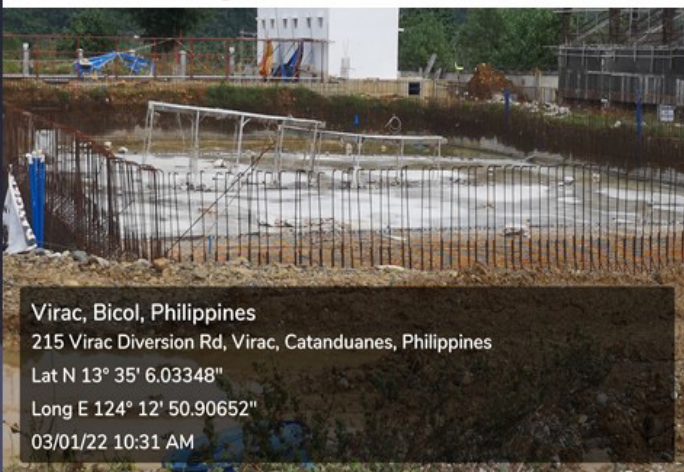
